



The United States Code stipulates, "When a U.S. flag is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning."

Historically, flags were made from hemp, silk, wool, and linen, and while many flags are made of cotton, more flags are produced from nylon and polyester. Burning nylon and polyester flags is not safe for the environment. Still, an alternative cutting process allows us to honor our Flag to offer a reverent method of final tribute.
