At the January 21, 2020 Board of Education Meeting, the Board:

In other action, the Board

- Approved the Recommended Board of Education Policy Updates
- Approved a 2020 Summer HVAC Project, not to exceed \$200,000 for the State of Illinois Maintenance Grant Application
- Approved the Life Safety Surveys for both Concord Elementary School and Cass Junior High School
- Authorized the Administration to Develop the Fiscal Year 2021 Budget


