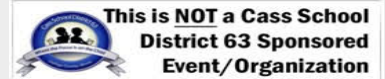

Target Audience

Family of students 14 years and older with developmental and intellectual disabilities, including autism, as well as those with higher physical disabilities and complex medical needs.

Services, Supports, Benefits, and Funding Covered

How to know what your student is eligible for, such as:

- PUNS
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) & Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI)
- Medicaid
- ABLE Accounts & Special Need Trusts
- Public transportation
- Supported Decision Making, Power of Attorney, and Guardianship
- Housing

This presentation is a great opportunity to learn the basics, ask questions, and increase understanding to feel more comfortable and confident with what your next steps should be.
