Board of Education Highlights

At the June 18, 2019 Board of Education Meeting, the Board:

2019/20 Tentative Budget Presented

District Director of Fiscal Services, Robert Strande, presented the tentative 2019/20 Budget to the Board of Education. The Tentative Budget is balanced. The Final Budget will be presented to the Board of Education for adoption at the September 17, 2019 Board of Education meeting and is available for viewing at any time at the Cass School District 63 District Office or on the District Website at 2019/20 Tentative Budget.

In other action, the Board

- Approved the 2019/20 Food Service Contract
- Approved a four-year Financial Auditor Contract.
- Approved an Intergovernmental Agreement with DuPage/West Cook Regional Association
- Approved a 2019/20 ISBE Consolidation Plan
- Approved a Resolution Expressing Official Intent Regarding Certain Capital Expenditures to be Reimbursed from Proceeds of an Obligation to be Issued by School District 63
- Approved Board of Education Policy updates.
- Reviewed possible Fall dates to conduct Superintendent Search

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At the August 20, 2019 Board of Education Meeting, the Board:

- Approved a Resolution Providing For The Issue Of Not To Exceed \$2,600,000 General Obligation Limited Tax School Bonds For The Purposes Of Increasing The Working Cash Fund And Refunding Outstanding Bonds, Providing For The Levy Of A Direct Annual Tax To Pay The Principal And Interest On Said Bonds, And Authorizing The Execution Of A Bond Purchase Agreement With Raymond James & Associates, Inc., In Connection With The Proposed Sale Of Said Bonds.
- Approved a Resolution Authorizing and Directing the Execution of an Escrow Agreement in Connection with the Issue of Taxable General Obligation Limited Tax Refunding School Bonds

Things You Should Know



Bus Etiquette

A reminder to all parents and students about the following bus rules:

None of the following are allowed on the buses under any circumstances:

- a. Disrespect to Others
- b. Disrespect to Property

- c. Profanity
- d. Eating
- e. Drinking
- f. Gum Chewing

If your child is found to be vandalizing a bus, the repair costs will become the responsibility of the school family and the student could be permanently removed from the bus.

Rules that apply while in school also apply on the buses. If rules are disrespected on the bus, the same disciplinary protocols will be followed as if the student were standing in the school.

Please review these rules with your child(ren) so that everyone is aware of the behavioral expectations both on the buses and in school.

Reminder About Drop Off And Pick-Up Procedures At The Schools

During drop-off/pick-up traffic around Concord Elementary School and Cass Junior High School can get extremely congested and we need to be very mindful of following proper procedures. The safety of our students; your children, depend upon it, especially during winter months when roads are slick and site lines are even more limited than usual.

If you are under a time constraint and do not have the necessary time available to move through the drop-off/pick-up procedures properly, we suggest you consult with the building and/or district administration.

It is also imperative that we maintain respect for our community members at all times. Please do not block their driveways in any way and/or use them to turn around. Please refrain from parking on the street to run in and pick your child up. This slows traffic patterns as well and causes frustrations to those around you who follow the proper procedures. As not all cars on the road are waiting to get into our schools, please also, whenever possible, move as far right on the road as possible. This will allow thru traffic to get by on your left.

If protocols and procedures are not followed there is a possibility that we will restrict a violator's access to the schools by personal vehicle. Finally, please remember that the law prohibits the use of hand held cell phones in school zones for any reason, including talking and texting.
