### **Board of Education Highlights**

# At the March 17, 2020 Board of Education Meeting, the Board:

Approved a New Policy

In light of the current, ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 Pandemic, the Board of Education voted unanimously to approve Policy 4:180 Pandemic Preparedness at last evening's Board of Education Meeting. At the meeting, the Board of Education also discussed at length the measures it has taken to ensure that Cass School District 63 students' academic needs are being met and plans moving forward.

### The Board Also Discussed

- Approved a CARE Grant in the amount of \$655.60 to supply lunch to Band students on Recording Day and for an Accompanist for the Cass Junior High School Chorus.
- The development of a Superintendent Advisory Coronavirus/COVID-19 Pandemic Committee, which will consistent of two Board of Education Members, one parent/guardian, one community member, one teacher and one support staff member.


