Prekindergarten Screening

A free developmental screening is a service provided for all prekindergarten children between the ages of three and five who are residents of Cass School District 63. The screenings are held three times each year in August, October, and February. The screening process takes approximately one hour to complete. The screening program is led by a team of school professionals and includes assessment of vision and hearing, speech and language development, social interaction, fine and large motor coordination, and verbal/written feedback from parents. Parents will have an opportunity to meet and consult with school personnel during the screening process.

Daily Snap Shot

Arrival: children cooperatively check backpacks & take attendance

Circle Time: whole group activities, i.e., stories, rhymes, songs, dances, acting; and “Planning Time”- children indicate play choices

Play Time: individual child initiated choices organized around play centers, i.e., gross motor, music, art, literacy, blocks/construction, sand, water, pretend, manipulatives and computer usage

Clean-up and Recall/Review: children retell their day’s activities through conversation, acting, drawing, or writing

Snack: snack includes hygiene, nutrition, and social skills

Quiet Reading: reading is done in small groups or individually

Small Group Time: child’s active involvement in sorting, counting, patterning, weighing, measuring, comparing, writing, drawing, book-making, toy construction, game playing-using manipulatives, books and pictures

Outdoor/Indoor Music and Movement

Closing Comments and Dismissal: Children are encouraged to collect their belongings independently

The Tuition program is combined with children who qualify for our At-Risk prekindergarten program along with children who are eligible for the Special Education program and have an Individual Education Plan.
